The organisation

As Australia's only national bird conservation charity, we are on a mission to put birds and nature on the path to recovery within a decade, leading and facilitating action that halts biodiversity loss and restores ecosystems. Position objective

The Advisor Nature Positive Investment is responsible for developing initiatives that leverage corporate Nature Positive and Environment, Social, and Governance (ESG) programs and increase investment in BirdLife Australia's priority conservation projects. This role focuses on understanding the emerging Nature Positive market mechanisms, priorities of corporate partners and identifying opportunities to increase engagement and investment. Specifically, the role will work with BirdLife staff to design and promote conservation, research and advisory projects that further the Bird Conservation Strategy (BCS) goals by delivering on Conservation Action Area 8 – Working with the private sector.

Status

This is a part time position (0.8 FTE), offered on a max term contract.

Duties

Strategy Development and Implementation:

• Support the development of strategy and frameworks to operationalise Bird Conservation Action Area 8 – Working with the private sector based on Nature Positive solutions and ESG initiatives.

Advisor Nature Positive Investment

Provide advice on integration and reporting of private sector engagement to existing BirdLife conservation projects.

Project Management:

- Develop and maintain with Conservation and Science team staff a pipeline of active and potential projects focused on Nature Positive solutions that meet BCS priorities.
- Explore with Conservation and Science team staff the potential for new scientific monitoring and research services that further private sector engagement and conservation outcomes (e.g. IBAT, Accounting for Nature)
- Support the development of Nature Positive Partnership opportunities including development of timelines, budgets, and resources to ensure successful execution and implementation.
- Supports the reporting on existing project outcomes against Conservation Action Area 8 indicators.

Stakeholder Engagement:

- Build and maintain partnerships with key stakeholders, including industry, government agencies, NGOs, academic institutions, and community groups.
- Advocate for the adoption of Nature Positive solutions in conservation policy and planning.

Research and Innovation:

- Identify and promote innovative approaches to Nature Positive solutions.
- Assess the effectiveness of Nature Positive solutions in financing or achieving BCS goals.

Education and Outreach:

- Contribute to educational materials and programs to raise awareness about nature positive solutions.
- Represent BirdLife Australia in media and public fora to promote Nature Positive conservation initiatives.

Selection Criteria

Essential

- A degree in Environmental Science, Conservation Biology, Economics, Finance, or a related field, with at least 5 years of relevant work experience.
- Demonstrated experience in developing and implementing Nature Positive conservation solutions.
- Strong project management skills, including budget management and reporting.
- Excellent interpersonal and relationship-building skills.
- Ability to represent BirdLife professionally and competently in negotiations with potential industry partners.
- Proven ability to work collaboratively with diverse stakeholders.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills.
- High level of computer literacy.

Desirable

Advisor Nature Positive Investment

- Experience working in industry, e.g. extractive or primary industries or the energy sector.
- Experience working in environmental or financial consultancy business.
- Knowledge of Australian ecosystems and conservation challenges.
- Experience in conservation finance and policy advocacy.
- Affinity with the aims and philosophy of a member-based not-for-profit conservation organisation.

- An ability to think outside the box and explore potential.
- A positive attitude towards taking on today's conservation challenges.
- A high level of professionalism in all work.
- A strategic thinker and leader.
